Did you know that this year marks the 75th anniversary of the founding of Hollin Hall? That didn't immediately occur to me, but it's true. As our welcoming sign on Shenandoah Road confirms, Hollin Hall Village began in 1943, even though the actual building construction apparently didn't commence until 1948, according to a Mount Vernon Patch article.

To help us celebrate our anniversary and ensure that Hollin Hall remains one of the top neighborhoods in the area, we hope you will take a moment to join or renew your membership in the Hollin Hall Village Citizens Association.

Hollin Hall is a true gem within Fairfax County and the greater DMV area!
